#### 9. COURSE REQUIREMENT

### 9.1. Rules of class participation

- Students to force majeure reasons, there must be sufficient and reasonable proofs.
- Students are responsible for actively researching documents, proactively preparing lessons before going to class according to the instructions and requests of lecturers.

- Students who submit individual and group assignments late compared with the prescribed time of the instructors will receive a score of 0 for that assignment.

- Regarding the exchange between lecturers and students: Encourage students to participate in discussions (groups and individuals), give direct feedback with teachers about the content of the course, teaching and learning methods, teaching materials and read. Lecturers also encourage students to give feedback on the form, methods and contents of the tests, and to evaluate students' learning results. Students can communicate with lecturers in class, during office hours or via email. The valuable student feedback contributes to improve the teaching and learning quality of the course.

#### 9.2. Rules of classroom behavior

- The course is conducted on the principle of respect for learners and teachers. All acts that interfere with the teaching and learning process are strictly prohibited.
